

The themes of our daily prayer times, personal and gathered, will be based on the following Scripture:

Praying Together



It is important for us to prioritise connecting with God, and whilst we can pray on our own wherever we are and whenever we have time, it can be especially powerful to be together when praying. So during the Week of Prayer we will have two daily prayer times where we can gather together to pray - one in-person, and one online:

Lunchtime: 12:15-1:15pm at RBC


Evening: 8:00-9:00pm via Zoom

But we know that those times won't work for everyone's work or family lives. Which is why we've produced this booklet to aid your own personal & family prayer times.



We also want to encourage you to gather together to pray with others at times which are convenient to you. Get together with a few friends and go for a prayer walk around your area, meet in your homes, or even in your favourite coffee shop.

Growing & Going



Our theme for this whole academic year is "Growing & Going" which will keep our focus firmly on discipleship & evangelism - two pillars of the Christian faith which are (or should be) inseparable. We want to unpack and demystify what we mean by 'evangelism' and reclaim the word & practice.

Our growth as disciples of Jesus should be an ongoing process. We should grow as disciples together, and we should go into our community together. As we grow, we should go; and as we go, we should also grow! We should do both with God, in fellowship, and within our community.

A key verse for growing and going is Matthew 4:19:

Jesus said "follow me, & I will make you fishers of men"



Up In Out :::::

We are called to be followers of Jesus, so what can we learn from His balanced approach to life, ministry & relationships? What can we learn that will help us to be better three-dimensional Disciples? The outline below is taken from Luke 6:

UP Leaning into God _____

"One of those days Jesus went out to a mountainside to pray, and spent the night praying to God." v12

No matter how busy He was, or how short of time, Jesus prioritised time with His Father.

IN Learning Together _____

"When morning came, he called his disciples to him and chose twelve of them, whom he also designated apostles" v13

Jesus selected those He wanted to journey with and they grew as disciples together on the way.

OUT Loving Others _____

"He went down and large crowd of his disciples was there and a great number of people from all over, who had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases." v17

After time with His Father and the Disciples, they went out together to be Good News (evangelism).

Three Dimensional Christians




"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer."

Awe & Wonder




"All the believers were together and had everything in common."

What does it look like for the believers to have everything in common? Not just the sharing of possessions/wealth (see tomorrow), but today think about what we have in common with each other as a Church family.

After the turbulence of the pandemic there is once again a general sense of unity across the fellowship, both when we gather together, but in conversations too. Over the last 18 months our votes at the Church Member's meeting have been unanimous or very close to it - possibly the most measurable indicator of what we have in common.


"They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need."

This verse provides a huge challenge. But we have a history of putting it into practice. Perhaps not by selling property and possessions, but certainly by making personal sacrifices in other ways for the benefit of others.

We see this regularly through giving to the Fellowship Fund which enables us to support one another in moments of need/crisis in particular. But we've seen this even more powerfully recently with the financial response to the Building Project.

Friday 24th Gathering



Expectation



Churches for Rayleigh (monthly)


