# **Key Themes**

#### 1. Belonging to God's Household (Ephesians 2:19-22)

- Paul emphasizes that believers are no longer outsiders but members of God's family.
- The Church is depicted as a building with Christ as the cornerstone, signifying stability, unity, and purpose.
- Together, believers form a dwelling place for God's Spirit,
  reflecting the importance of community and mutual support.

#### 2. Unity and Growth in the Body of Christ (Ephesians 4:11-16)

- Christ equips the Church with various roles and gifts to build up the body of believers.
- Unity in faith and knowledge of Christ is essential for maturity.
- Growth happens through speaking the truth in love and each member doing their part to strengthen the whole body.
